




A Homiletic Commentary on the Book of Lamentations (Classic Reprint) (Paperback)

Excerpt from A Homiletic Commentary on the Book of Lamentations Preachers appear to have shunned the Book op Lamentations, as if it lacked suggestiveness for homiletic purposes; and there are comparatively few sermons based on texts selected from this portion of Holy Writ. It may be that the undertone of melancholy, that runs so sadly through the five elegies of which the book is composed, has created the impression that the theme is too monotonous to admit of the freshness and variety expected from the pulpit of the present day. A little patient study of the book in detail will correct that impression. The predominating subject is indeed a story of desolation and sorrow; but it is told with a marvellous versatility of poetic imagery and with exquisite pathos. The Lamentations are more than the lamentations of Jeremiah - more than the lamentations of the Jews, who were the immediate and principal sufferers in the disasters narrated: they are typical of a sorrow that is as universal as humanity.
